

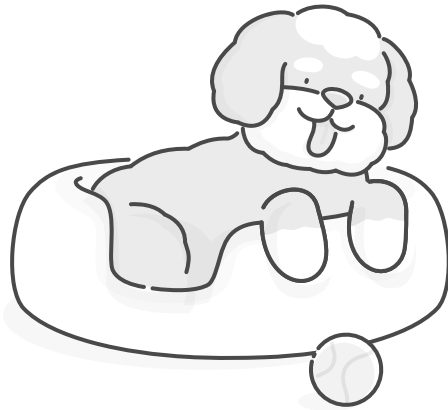
Dog Boarding Checklist

Take a screenshot or print this list to stay organized and guarantee your dog's boarding experience is smooth and stress-free.

What to bring

Double-check with the boarding facility to confirm which items are allowed or required.

- Toys
- Bed/blanket
- Medications (labeled with instructions)
- Leash/collar (with updated ID tags)
- Poop bags
- Food (labeled)
- Treats
- Vaccination records
- Dog brush
- Blanket or shirt that smells like you



How to prepare your dog to leave home

- Do a short trial— 1 to 2 days—stay to help them adjust, if possible
- Familiarize your pup with crates/carriers
- Keep your departure stress-free and positive
- Introduce your dog to the facility team

Health preparations

Consult your vet to ensure everything is up-to-date and confirm any specific requirements with the facility.

- Maintain active pet insurance coverage for unexpected accidents and illnesses.
- Make sure all required vaccines are up-to-date.
- Confirm fecal testing shows negative results to prevent the spread of parasites.
- Keep flea and heart worm prevention medications current.
- Schedule a routine checkup with your vet a few weeks prior to boarding.
