## Whose Responsibility Is It?



When there are issues with your rental, you might be wondering— is it on the tenant or the landlord to take care of the bill? Let's break it down.

## Landlord



Handling structural issues and repairs is on the landlord, including covering the costs to:

- Fix burst pipes
- Repair damaged floors from leaks
- Maintain heating systems
- Address plumbing issues
- Restore after a fire
- Fix broken doors/windows
- Replace faulty wiring
- Repair roof leaks
- Pest control for structural issues
- Maintain the building
- Temporary living expenses for tenant, depending on the lease

## Tenant



Responsibility for personal belongings within the four walls is on the tenant, including covering the costs of:

- Damage to personal items like a TV or sofa
- Losses from theft
- Damage from other tenants
- Replacing lost keys
- Repairing tenant-caused damage
- Pest control for cleanliness issues
- Maintain a clean living environment
- Temporary living expenses, depending on the lease
